What beliefs do anarchists share? by Bryan Caplan Anarchism is defined by The American Heritage College Dictionary as "The theory or doctrine that all forms of government are unnecessary, oppressive, and undesirable and should be abolished."

But optimistic, "revolution-is-now" anarchists believe that anarchism has made, and is still making, a useful contribution. What Anarchists Do This chapter is intended to describe in general terms, without giving names, what goes on in the anarchist movement in Britain in the latter part of the twentieth century.

Anarchists are made out to be essentially one happy family, but squabbling over trivia. Freedom Press has one set of anarchist ideas. There are other strands of anarchism such as anarcho-syndicalism or anarcho-communism and there are clear political differences between them. That is why we are in different groups.

Anarchists oppose the state, capitalism, white supremacy, patriarchy, imperialism and other forms of oppression, not because they believe in disorder; but rather because they believe in equal freedom for all and oppose all forms of exploitation, domination and hierarchy.

While many anarchists have traditionally been sceptical of and opposed to organized religion, many different religions have served as inspiration for religious forms of anarchism, most notably Christianity as Christian anarchists believe that biblical teachings give credence to anarchist philosophy.

-while marxists believe the state will 'wither away' as class antagonism abates, anarchists argue states can only be abolished Explain the link between anarchism and individualism -Individualism is the belief in the primacy of the human individual over any social group or collective body

*Communist anarchists believe that people will work without material incentive, and that the absence of property will virtually eliminate the problem of crime. The few offenders that do exist can be dealt with informally - is no need for a legal system
