It is thought to be the first proven act of air sabotage in commercial aviation. 7 9 September 1949 Canadian Pacific Air Lines In-flight bombing: Joseph-Albert Guay packed a bomb made of dynamite in the baggage carried by his wife. The explosion occurred after take off, leading to the death of all 19 passengers and 4 crew on the Douglas DC-3. Guay was tried and sentenced to death by hanging on 12 January 1951.
