With an area of 96 square miles, Santa Cruz Island is the largest of the Northern Channel Islands and is also the largest island in the entire chain. It is situated 19 miles south of the Santa Barbara coastline. Anacapa Island, Santa Cruz's closest island neighbor, is located 5 miles to the east.

The Santa Cruz Island restoration program is part of the National Park Service mission, as mandated by Congress, to preserve unimpaired the natural and cultural resources and values of the national park system for the enjoyment, education, and inspiration of this and future generations.

Santa Cruz has the longest paved road in Galapagos, which runs north-south across the island, taking people from the airport ferry at Itabaca Canal on the north coast into the highlands and through a few smaller towns on its way down to Puerto Ayora, the island's largest city located on the southern coast of the island in Academy Bay.

Channel Islands National Park supports a diverse terrestrial flora, including many rare, relict, and endemic species, as well as many nonnative species.
