

Download Janacek Leos String Quartet No 1 Kreutzer Sonata Two Violins

Leoš Janáček's String Quartet No. 1, "Kreutzer Sonata", was written in a very short space of time, between 13 and 28 October 1923, at a time of great creative concentration.

- Composer: Leoš Janáček (3 July 1854 -- 12 August 1928) - Performers: The Janáček Quartet - Year of recording: 1966 String Quartet No. 1, Kreutzer Sonata, JW 7/8, written in 1923.

Leoš Janáček's String Quartet No. 1 is subtitled "The Kreutzer Sonata," after the story by Leo Tolstoy upon which it is based; the title of Tolstoy's story, of course, is taken from Ludwig van Beethoven's ninth violin sonata.

Leoš Janáček, 1854-1928 String Quartet No. 1, "Kreutzer Sonata", 1923. In several ways, Leoš Janáček was the polar opposite of Mozart and Mendelssohn.

Czech composer Leos Janacek [1854-1828] wrote two brilliant string quartets. I have discussed the second, Intimate Letters (August, 2017), and here I shall discuss his first quartet, Kreutzer Sonata.

About This Item Inspired by Leo Tolstoy's controversial novella The Kreutzer Sonata (which was itself partially inspired by Beethoven's eponymous piano and violin sonata), Janáček's String Quartet No. 1 breaks free of traditional harmonic and formal structures.
