Paul Nitze was a cofounder of Team B, a 1970s intelligence think tank that challenged the National Intelligence Estimates provided by the CIA. The Team B reports became the intellectual foundation for the idea of "the window of vulnerability " and of the massive arms buildup that began toward the end of the Carter administration and accelerated under President Ronald Reagan .
