Jesus in all the books of the Bible How is Jesus revealed in every Bible book from Genesis to Revelation? The Bible is about Jesus.

It is supremely a book that speaks about relationships, highlighting those between God and his creation, between God and humankind, and between human beings. Exodus The book lays a foundational theology in which God reveals his name, his attributes, his redemption, his law and how he is to be worshiped.
