The Big Sleep (1939) is a hardboiled crime novel by Raymond Chandler, the first to feature the detective Philip Marlowe. It has been adapted for film twice, in 1946 and again in 1978 . The story is set in Los Angeles.

His seven novels represent something highly sophisticated and nuanced and one tends to forget the origin, the trashy pulp-fiction of hardboiled detectives. The Big Sleep (1939) is the first novel to feature the private eye Philip Marlowe, and is derived from two short stories, Killer in the Rain (1935) and The Curtain (1936). A method Chandler repeated often to write several of his novels, he called it "cannibalizing".

The best way to understand him is to think of him as many critics have—as a modern-day knight.

The Philip Marlowe series would begin in 1939 with The Big Sleep. Chandler's final completed Marlowe novel was Playback in 1958, although he would leave Poodle Springs unfinished. Parker would finish that novel in 1989 and then go on to write Perchance To Dream in 1991 – the only authorized sequel.

Philip Marlowe (/ ˈ m ʔ r l oʔ /) is a fictional character created by Raymond Chandler. Marlowe first appeared under that name in The Big Sleep, published in 1939. Chandler's early short stories, published in pulp magazines like Black Mask and Dime Detective, featured similar characters with names like "Carmady" and "John Dalmas".
